God's Riches At Christ's Expense

The term 'Grace' is a very favorite word for the New Testament authors. The Greek word for grace, 'Charis', occurs 154 times in the New Testament of which 89 of these occur in the letters of Paul. It can have meanings such as graciousness, favor, goodwill, gracious deed or gifts, and thanks or gratitude. The simple definition of the term 'Grace' is unmerited favor. In an acrostic fashion we define the word 'Grace' as follows: **G**od's **R**iches **At C**hrist's **E**xpense

The terms 'Grace' and 'Mercy' are like sisters. While the terms have similar meaning, grace and mercy are not the same. Grace is what we get, which we do not deserve. But mercy is what we do not get, which we do deserve. For example, the wrath of God, we deserve it, but we do not get it because of God's mercy.

Paul combines 'Grace' and 'Peace' to construct a distinctive Christian greeting to the churches. Even though both terms are combined in his greeting, one thing is to be noticed: the term 'Peace' always follows the term 'Grace', not vice versa. It brings us a message: where there is grace, there is peace.

One of the most important passages concerning the Grace of God is in Titus 2:11-14, "For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good."

Few important points about the Grace of God can be traced from this passage:

- Grace is a part of the character of God
- The Grace of God has appeared to us in Jesus Christ
- The Grace of God has brought salvation to all men

The Grace of God teaches us to live upright and godly lives in the present age An old hymn fittingly describes God's grace:

> "...It streams the whole creation reach, So plenteous is its store, Enough for all, enough for each, Enough for evermore..."
