Our Priority: Live a Life of Praise

Praise is a theme that pervades the whole of scripture. Words that are often used as synonyms or in parallel with praise are 'bless', 'exalt', 'extol', 'glorify', 'magnify', 'thank', and 'confess'. To praise God is to call attention to His glory. Unquestionably the book of psalms is a centerpiece for any concern about praise. In it the believer's vocation to praise is wonderfully modeled, so that even laments (one- third of all psalms) contain elements of praise.

The Psalms as a book of praises build to a remarkable crescendo of praise (Ps. 145-150), in which creatures are summoned to incessant praise of God, as are the stars and planets in the heavens, and even the angels. We have seen and heard many choirs but never one like Ps. 148. The highest heavens and the water laden clouds are singing "Glory to God in the highest..." All are honoring God as their creator. It is He who gave permanence and stability to His creation, and who built into it certain laws and principles which are unvarying.

Praise is a matter of obedience to our God. It stems from deliberately focusing on Him. It is the result of being willfully God-centered in our thinking. Praise is a natural and necessary response. The chief end of man is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever. The Believer's commentary on Ps. 150 raises four key questions and answers on the subject of praise: Where, What, How, and Who?

Where? Praise Him in His sanctuary and in His mighty firmament, which is another way of saying everywhere- on earth and in heaven.

What? For His mighty acts and according to His excellent greatness. It means for what He has done for us and for who He is.

How? With an orchestra of every kind of instrument. Capture every note and chord in the world of music to honor the King of Kings.

Who? Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Here is the basic qualification for praise. How much more are we blessed in the redemption and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit which helps join in the choir for a burst of praise to God, Hallelujah! Praise the Lord.
