Assurance in God's Promise of Provision

The Philippian church was the only church that extended financial support to Paul's ministry. He expresses the joyful relationship which existed between the church and himself in connection with practical assistance. *Philippians 4:19* shouldn't be seen out of context but is to be interpreted and applied meaningfully in our life. When a church is consistent in Christian stewardship the assurance is promised that God would supply all their needs.

"My God"- The expression is very emphatic. The vertical relationship is very foundational in church affairs which is evidenced horizontally. Paul had accepted the offerings from them in the past, not to himself but to God whose minister he was.

"All your needs"- Every need of yours, spiritual and temporal. God is concerned with every part of our being, spirit, soul, and body. God's promise for us is beyond anything we can ask or imagine (Eph. 3:20). God provides a way for us to develop an intimate relationship with Him. There is a big difference between 'wants' and 'needs'. "Want" is related with greed and selfishness and "need" is something essential and indispensable.

"According to His riches in glory"- His abundant fullness. The method of imparting supplies to people was through Jesus Christ or was done in a glorious manner. Whatever God does is done in a way worthy of Himself, and so as to illustrate His own perfections. If a millionaire gives hundred dollars to charity is out of his riches but if he gives a hundred thousand dollars, it would be according to his riches.

Hudson Taylor, the missionary to China had complete trust in God's faithfulness. He wrote in his journal, "Our heavenly Father is a very experienced one. He knows very well that His children wake up with a good appetite every morning. He sustained 3 million Israelites in the wilderness for 40 years. If God send 3 million missionaries to China, He would have ample means to sustain them all... Depend on it. God's work done in God's way will never lack God's supply".

Let us not allow frustrations to prevail over the Church, instead, trust in in his assurance of wonderful provisions. Never dream of just survival in the context of challenges and needs but look forward to overcome and thrive in His abundant provision.

My friend, rejoice that you are rich "according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus". This is far greater and more dependable than the temporal riches that you might have from any earthly source!
